PROFESSIONALISM Lead by personal example	 Always dress, speak and comport yourself in a professional manner in the presence of students.
LOYALTY Provide a healthy atmosphere for success	 Always speak well of the school, fellow instructors and staff in the presence of students. Always support school policy decisions to the students. Never speak ill of a student, fellow employee, or of the Institute to a student or class.
STUDENT RELATIONS Teach the value of respect	 Maintain a helpful and professional relationship with the student. Treat all students equally and equitably. Never show favoritism. Keep personal life and problems private. Do not socialize in a possibly compromising situation or setting.
INSTRUCTION Consistent Quality Performance	 Be technically competent in the subject matter of your course. Read, understand, and follow the course syllabus and related administrative instructions. Provide fair and comprehensive testing in accordance with school policy and procedures. Grade and return student tests and homework promptly. Provide challenging and interesting material to the student.
CARING ABOUT THE STUDENT Success-Oriented Training!	 Know the name of each student. Keep students focused on graduation and completion. Require students to produce quality work ON TIME. Never "cut corners". Teach the student to set goals and help them to get there. Build student pride and self-esteem through task accomplishment and a "cando" attitude.

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
